Prerequisite:

The ASB elective has a requirement that students maintain a Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.5 or higher at all times. If an individual's grades drop below this level at any time during the year, s/he will be placed on academic probation for one grading period. If s/he fails to achieve a 2.5 GPA by the following grading period, s/he will be dropped from the course.

Course Description:

This elective course is designed to serves as a student government, representing all Mt. Everest Academy students. Students enrolled in this course act as event planners for a wide range of campus activities throughout the academic year. Students are expected to develop and demonstrate leadership skills and to take their roles as "model students" seriously. The course is intended to help students strengthen their leadership skills by addressing communication, time management, goal setting, interpersonal relations, and intrapersonal reflection. While there is a faculty advisor, students are expected to be self-directed and self-reliant.

Directions:

Submit two copies of a monthly leadership reflection document and two copies of a monthly research paper -- one to the supervising teacher and one to the ASB advisor on or before each monthly due date. Objectives & Methods of Study:

Students in this course are expected to develop leadership skills including: time management, goal setting, interpersonal relations, and intrapersonal reflection. In order to do so, it is imperative that students participate in the weekly ASB meetings and all ASB events. The monthly leadership reflection document guides intrapersonal development related to the leadership skills aligned with the goals of this course.
